# COURSE DESCRIPTION

Creative Writing: Introduction to Screenwriting is an introductory course designed for aspiring screenwriters eager to explore the art of crafting compelling stories for the screen. Students will learn the foundational principles of screenplay writing, including concept and theme development, dramatic structure, character arc, dialogue, visual storytelling, and proper script formatting. Drawing from personal experiences, observations, and imagination, students will develop their storytelling skills through writing exercises, class discussions, script analyses, and film critiques. The course emphasizes hands-on learning, encouraging students to refine their creative voices and technical abilities. As a culmination of their efforts, students will produce a polished short screenplay as their final project.

## **PREREQUISITES**

Undergraduate Semester level ENGL 1102. Minimum Grade of 'D.'

- Equip students with the ability to format screenplays to industry standards and employ visual storytelling techniques effectively.
- Foster the ability to analyze and critique scripts and films for their thematic, structural, and cultural elements.

# LEARNING OUTCOMES

Upon successful completion of the course ...

- Students will develop an understanding of the foundational principles of screenwriting, including dramatic structure, theme, character arc, conflict, pacing, and resolution.
- Students will generate compelling ideas, characters, and narratives by drawing on personal experiences, observations, and imagination.
- Students will learn the technical skills of screenplay formatting and the effective use of visual language in storytelling.
- Students will produce a polished short screenplay culminating in the creative and technical skills developed during the course.
