## COURSE DESCRIPTION

**Documentary Film** introduces students to documentary filmmaking as both a research methodology and a creative medium capable of catalyzing dialogue around social justice issues and inspiring audience action. Through the course, students will examine significant movements, styles, and trends in fact-based film, focusing on its cultural implications and formal strategies. Students will explore classic and contemporary documentaries' artistic and technical compositions to understand how filmmakers address societal challenges. The course offers multiple opportunities for hands-on production experience through workshops and in-class practical exercises. Drawing on the knowledge and skills acquired, students will culminate their learning by creating a micro-documentary as their final project.

### PREREQUISITES

Undergraduate Semester level ENGL 1102. Minimum Grade of 'C.'

- Guide students in creating a micro-documentary that integrates research, technical proficiency, and creative expression.

Upon successful completion of the course ...

- Students will distinguish and critically evaluate the principle 'modes' of documentary making.
- Students will understand the contextual factors that shape the message in a film for a diverse audience.
- Students will discuss contemporary nonfictional content that explores Scientific Innovation, Anthropology, Progressive Social Movements, and Auto-Ethnographic exploration.
- Students will demonstrate the skills required to produce high-quality content, including story development, cinematography, editing, and audio production/post-production skills.
